#### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

In May 2014, the Topo House was recognized as House of the Month in the critically-acclaimed magazine, *Architectural Record*. VaproShield's vapor permeable breathable air barrier membrane was used in a rain screen design behind concrete fiber board while the cladding helped to complement the outback spirit of the hill-hugging landform fixed within the rolling hills of rural Wisconsin.

VaproShield breathable membranes were installed behind the specially-designed suspended concrete panels, which allow air flow and prevents moisture intrusion, reducing the risk for mold or mildew growth. Topo House also used a CNC fabricated black anodized-aluminum exterior while the VaproShield membranes offer exceptional flexibility to be used with multiple cladding, concrete panels and siding.
